USCIS does not publish sample sentences for the writing portion of the naturalization test, however, below is a collection of written questions shared by applicants post-interview.

Understand that the examiner can make up a sentence. However, they are always simple sentences.

The official vocabulary that the examiner uses to construct sentences for the Written Test is available on the USCIS website. The applicant may be asked to write on a touch-sensitive surface/tablet.
