Building Community in Walker Memorial

Built in 1916, Walker Memorial has long been a hub for student activities on the MIT campus. Walker initially housed the only campus dining hall and exercise room. Its historic walls are now home to many student group offices, event spaces, and the campus radio station, WMBR. Over the last several years, the Campus Activities Complex has worked hard to foster a stronger building community with Kerri Mills, Assistant Manager, taking a lead in the effort. One of Kerri's first tasks was to make the building greener, both figuratively and literally, by instituting a building-wide recycling program and distributing plants throughout the building. Walker is open 24 hours per day, seven days a week so a key concern for the building and its occupants is safety. With advice from the Campus Police, Kerri brought in the necessary technology and strategies to make the building a safer environment.

In addition to these projects, the CAC has worked with its partnering MIT groups to facilitate repairs and upgrades to a variety of Walker spaces, including the Black Student Union Lounge, Rainbow Lounge, Walker Dance Studio, Muddy Charles, Pritchett Dining and many student offices. The Walker community also enjoys several new lounge areas as well as the older spaces that have been given a facelift with new carpet, furniture, and plants. Event spaces such as Pritchett and Conference Room B have also been updated and are available to the MIT community.

Keeping the community spaces in our buildings safe and updated is a priority for the CAC and we would like to thank Kerri for her enthusiasm and commitment to Walker and its inhabitants, as she moves into a new position with our neighbors, the Student Activities Office. Space Profile - Kresge Auditorium

Dedicated in 1955, Kresge Auditorium serves as the major multi-purpose facility on the campus, hosting over 180 events per year. This facility contains a 1200 seat auditorium with a Holtkamp organ, a smaller 200 seat theater, and several rehearsal rooms. Famed architect Eero Saarinen designed the building and it is considered a major example of modern architecture. Designed in conjunction with the MIT Chapel and surrounding area, Saarinen saw the building as part of the larger landscape, not just a stand alone auditorium. The building originally had an orastone roof (brilliant white) but because of cracking/leaking problems, it has transitioned to a lead roof (1960s), and finally the current copper roof (1970s). Ironically, Saarinen's original designs included a copper roof but no one at the time knew how to attach it to this type of structure.

As inscribed on its dedication plaque, Kresge serves as "The Meeting House of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology." From the beginning, Kresge has hosted many significant events. For its opening ceremony, the organ played a commissioned piece by Aaron Copland, "Canticle of Freedom" with the MIT Symphony Orchestra accompanied by a choral group. During the 1955-56 school year, famed poet T.S. Elliot had three readings in Kresge. This tradition has continued with many fine performances, conferences, cultural events, and lectures, hosted by departments and student groups at MIT. Kresge also serves as the home for the MIT Symphony Orchestra, MIT Wind Ensemble, Dramashop, and many Theater Arts productions and classes.



Every month, we contact some of the event planners that have had events in our spaces and ask them to participate in a survey. The information that we receive from the survey answers helps us to understand how we can better serve the MIT community.
