## Heuristic Evaluation: Ski School Scheduler

Note: There are a number of important aspects of the design that I am unable to comment on (in particular feedback and some aspects of learnability) because most of the site functionality is not implemented. I cannot comment much on the administrator's calendar because I don't understand what it does (whose schedule it shows).
