HW2 - Heuristic Evaluation of SitterPlan

Collaboration: I did not collaborate with anyone on this assignment.

1. Major: **applyJobPopup should have a user-friendly name** (match the real world)

In the babysitter main page, clicking "Apply" next to a job brings up a popup with the name "applyJobPopup".

Recommendation: Change the name to something written in clear English.



2. Major: **No information about which jobs have been applied to** (recognition, not recall, visibility of system status)

In the babysitter main page, after applying for a job and closing the "applyJobPopup", there is no feedback on the screen saying the user applied to a particular job. This is a problem because if the user forgets which job she applied to, there is nothing on the screen to remind her.

Recommendation: Add some kind of status indicator next to the jobs the user has already applied to.

3. Major: Nothing prevents the user from applying to the same job twice (error prevention)


Since there is no status indicator saying the user applied to a particular job, the user can apply to the same job multiple times.

Recommendation: Make the "Apply" button inactive if the user has already applied for the job, or change the button to say "Modify Application".



4. Minor: **Slider for editing the schedule is unnecessary and unfamiliar** (external consistency, minimalist design)

In both the babysitter screen and the parents' screen, there is a popup containing a schedule in which you can "paint" a calendar. Next to the calendar is a slider, which adjusts how much of a 24-hour period is visible on the screen. The problem with this slider is that there is no external consistency, and it seems to add unnecessary complexity. It could even be harmful since the user may paint part of the calendar, adjust the slider, and hide that input so it's no longer visible.



Recommendation: Show the whole 24-hour period, or use a traditional scrollbar.

5. Minor: **Not enough distinction between table headings and rows** (hierarchy, match the real world)

In the babysitter page, there are boxes containing tabular data. The headings are too similar to the rest of the text in the table (same font, size and color), and are not easily distinguished from the rows.

Recommendation: Establish a hierarchy by using more visual variables such as size, color, etc.



6. Minor: **Unnecessary amount of whitespace between table columns** (efficiency, aesthetic & minimalist design)

In the tables on the babysitter page, there is an unnecessary amount of whitespace between the columns, requiring me to scroll horizontally to see the whole table.

Recommendation: Minimize the whitespace so that the columns are still distinct but not overly far apart. It may be worth using other tools to set the columns apart such as left-justifying the column data.

7. Minor: **Toolbar buttons are not aligned** (aesthetic & minimalist design, consistency & standards)

In the babysitter screen, the buttons in the toolbar for Edit Schedule, Calendar View, and Manage Contacts are not aligned with anything. Likewise, in the parents' screen, the Create Job and Manage Contacts buttons are oddly far apart and not aligned with anything.

Recommendation: Move the buttons closer to each other or align them with the table columns.

8. Cosmetic: **Text boxes are not aligned** (aesthetic & minimalist design, consistency & standards)

In the parents' screen, in the Create Job popup, the text boxes for Job title and Details are not aligned with each other.

Recommendation: Align the text boxes on the right and left, use whitespace more effectively to separate the Job title, Time, and Details.

9. Good: Create Job interface is consistent with Edit Schedule interface (internal consistency)


The parents' interface for creating a job and the babysitters' interface for editing their schedule are consistent since they both show a table of gray boxes which can be "painted" green by holding and moving the mouse.

10. Good: Manage Contacts interface is consistent for parents and babysitters (internal consistency)

Parents and babysitters see the same interface for managing their list of contacts.

11. Good: **Scheduling interface is reminiscent of doodle** (external consistency, match the real world)

The scheduling interface that babysitters and parents see in which they can "paint" the times that work for them is reminiscent of doodle. This allows for easy learnability since users may have already learned to use this feature in doodle.



12. Major: **Difficult to read black text on dark blue and dark gray background** (error prevention, visibility)

In the Calendar view in the babysitters' screen, some of the boxes are very difficult to read because they show black text on a dark blue or dark gray background.

Recommendation: Change the foreground or background color to increase contrast and make the text more readable.

13. Major: **Unscheduled blocks are different colors, and it's not clear why** (help & documentation, visibility of system status)

In the Calendar view from the babysitter's screen, some of the unscheduled blocks of time are different colors. For example, on Wednesday, the unscheduled blocks are dark yellow, while the unscheduled blocks in the rest of the week are light yellow. It's unclear what this means. (See previous screenshot in item 12).

Recommendation: Add a legend or make all unscheduled blocks the same color.

14. Major: **Easy to apply to a job by mistake** (error prevention)

When clicking "Apply" next to a job in the babysitters' screen, there is no intermediate confirmation dialog, so it's easy to click the button and apply to a job by mistake. This is especially true since all the Apply buttons are right next to each other, so the user may intend to apply for one job and end up applying for another.

Recommendation: Add an intermediate step so that the user must confirm the action of applying to a particular job.

15. Minor: **Possible to create an empty job posting** (error prevention)

From the parents' screen, it's possible to create a job without any timeslot, without a name, and without details. This may cause the user to think they successfully added their posting even though they missed all the required information.

Recommendation: The interface should prevent people from creating empty job postings by disabling the "Post Job" button if the required information is not present.

16. Major: No way to delete a job after creating it (user control & freedom)

From the parents' screen, there is no way to delete a job after creating it. Peoples' schedules may change and it's likely they may no longer need someone for a particular timeslot.

Recommendation: Add a way for users to delete jobs they have created.

17. Good: **Step-by-step process for creating a job is easy to learn** (help & documentation)

The process for creating a job from the parents' screen is well-documented and easy to understand. The two-step process for first selecting the timeslot and then adding details is logical. It's also helpful that the selected timeslot is repeated on the second page as feedback for the user.
