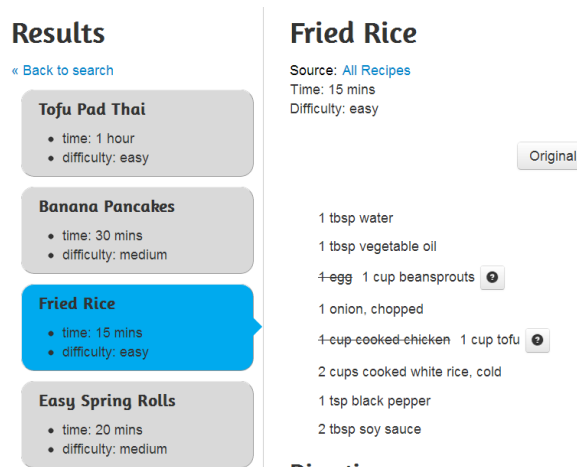
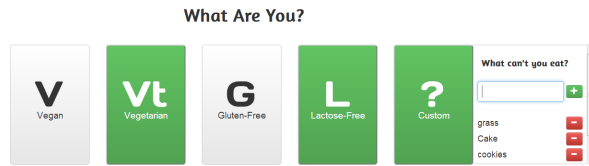

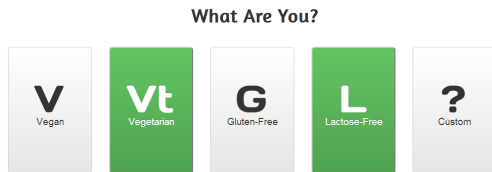
1. Overall appearance - good
 - a. I really like the clean color choices and subtle wallpaper in the background. elicits thoughts of dining room and clean kitchen tablecloth/walls.
2. Color - good
 - a. Similar to the previous comment, I like the greyscale consistency across the webpage, with splashes of color on important areas.
3. Selection Color Consistency - Cosmetic
 - a. not sure why you chose to use blue on your results page at all. I thought the grey, orange, green was working great.

4. Multiple Selection - (Learnability) Cosmetic
 - a. It wasn't immediately obvious to me that multiple selection was allowed. I actually figured it must be true only after trying the "custom" tag.
 - b. Suggestion: The prompt question could be "What dietary restriction(s) do you follow?" or something of the like that suggests multiple things are possible
5. Custom Dialog - (Safety) Minor
 - a. A consistency problem that bothered me, and could lead to someone mistaking thinking they deselected Custom. When you click the custom button after adding things, it goes from green to grey again. The things you entered are obviously still there, but it looks "deselected" i.e. in the example below, after closing the custom box, it looks like I'm saying I'm only Vegetarian and Lactose free, when I also don't eat ___list_of_things_still_in_custom___

6. Question wording - cosmetic

a. "What can't you eat" isn't in line with everything else and is a little less accurate than "What do you not eat?"

7. Clickable title - cosmetic

a. Just something that people usually expect. :)

8. Numbered directions - (Efficiency) major

a. I was pretty confused by this. aren't directions always numbered? makes it easy to glance and reference. a paragraph of directions is pretty hard to follow.

Directions

Pour the flour, salt, granulated sugar, cinnamon, and baking powder in a large bowl and combine. Mix in the mashed bananas and soy milk. Stir until combined. Let the pancake batter sit for 5 minutes before using. Pre-heat oven to 200 degrees. Heat a large skillet with 1-2 Tbsp of the oil over medium heat. Cook until bubbles begin to form around the edge of the pancakes. Flip and cook for another 2-3 minutes. Add remaining oil as needed and continue to cook pancakes until all the batter is gone.

- a. time and difficulty fields are self-explanatory

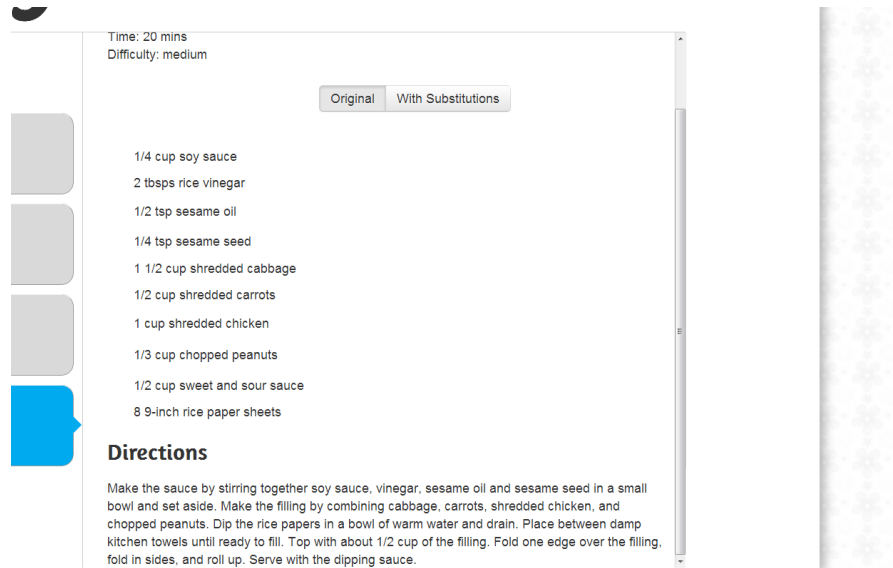

15. Context box positioning - minor

- a. Something about the results page content box hitting the bottom of the window bothers me.
